

Citizen Scholar Program

The Fort Monmouth Chapter will again sponsor its annual Citizen Scholar Program. This year marks the ninth consecutive year the chapter will recognize area students for their academic achievements, civic commitment and volunteer service to their community.

The chapter's Citizen Scholar Program was created to recognize high school seniors, soldiers, their family members, and other civilians who are currently enrolled or accepted for enrollment in a college level undergraduate program and have also distinguished themselves through their record of volunteerism and community involvement.

Because the program places a strong emphasis on citizenship and volunteerism as well as academic achievement, all applications must include an essay that details to the evaluation panel their involvement in community service and volunteer activities. The applicant must also be sponsored by a Fort Monmouth AUSA chapter member.

Individuals who wish to compete for this program are required to submit an application packet that will be evaluated by a panel of judges appointed by the president of the chapter.

All packets must be complete and postmarked by April 16, 2007.
